The renewed Scientific Committee meets in Rome



On July 14th, Enel Foundation marked a major step forward with the first meeting of its newly appointed Scientific Committee, affirming itself as a global knowledge platform on the role and the future of energy. The day unfolded in **two key moments**, each shaping the Foundation's strategic outlook for the years ahead.

Representatives from **government, academia, and the industries** gathered to spotlight the Foundation's growing international role and its portfolio of capacity-building and research programs.

Chaired by **Laura Cozzi**, Director of Sustainability, Technology and Outlooks and Chief Energy Modeller at the International Energy Agency (IEA), the Committee brought together leading academics from institutions such as MIT, Harvard, Bocconi, Luiss, Politecnico di Milano, and Politecnico di Torino.

Discussions focused on strategic research areas and the Foundation's international training initiatives (especially in the context of the **Mattei Plan**), aimed at fostering fact based work on energy transition, starting from science, giving stakeholders facts and numbers in order to guarantee relevance and real impact.
